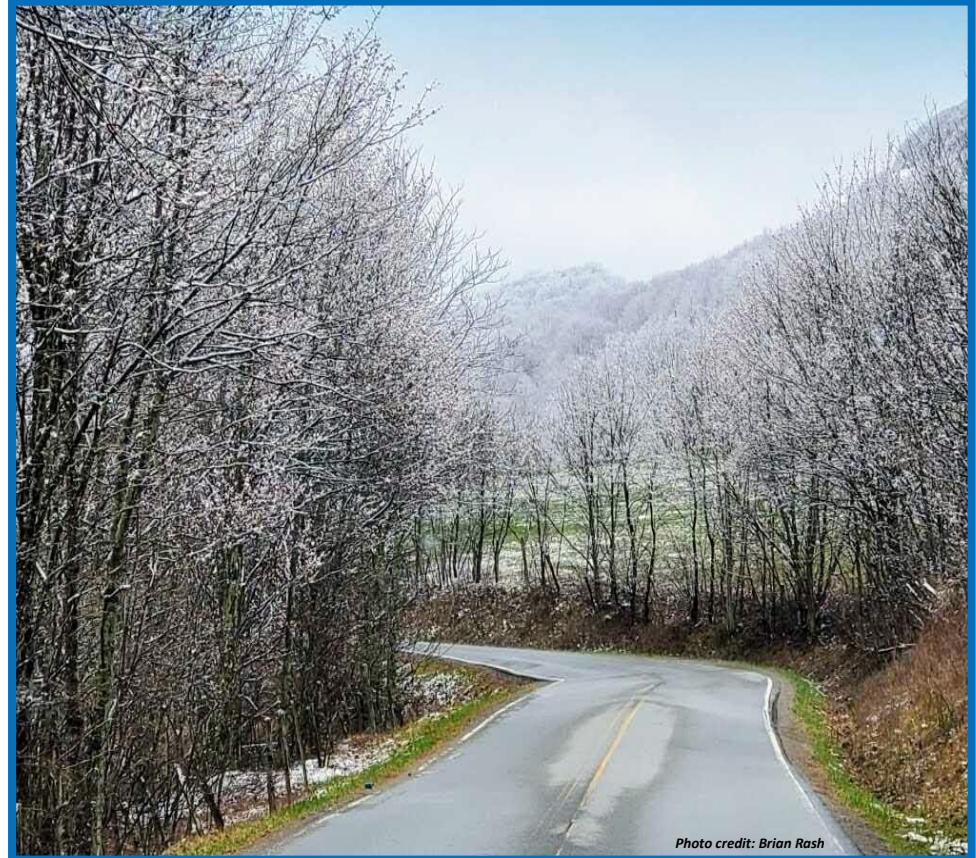

What An Incredible Year!

Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow! Gratitude, Humility, and Awe overwhelm me as I pause (briefly) to reflect on the past year and all the Lord has done through the incredibly talented, faithful, and generous members of the First Baptist Church Family. I cannot cite everything here, but think about the Food Boxes we packed at Hope Ministries to help feed senior adults in Wilkes and surrounding counties who are in need. We supported our school systems, our schoolchildren and their athletic teams financially this year. We made a difference with our gifts to Safe Spot, Circles of Care, Hope Ministries, the Wilkes Free Dental Clinic and the Hospitality House among others. In addition to our budget, many individuals and SS Classes supported local charities to the tune of \$26,000 and the Women of the Church Christmas Bazaar chipped in another \$11,000. We mailed 130 boxes full of love and presents to needy folks in Appalachia this Christmas. We also began a Food Giveaway ministry that will continue into this year. Our church cooked and served meals at the St. Paul's Crisis Ministry each month and we gave money to support their efforts to help folks in our community pay their bills. We loved each other and ministered to each other in times of sickness and grief. We worshiped together and celebrated the religious seasons of the year with beautiful music, fanfare, as well as reverence. Many grew closer through participation in Small Groups, and we continued to study and talk about scripture in Sunday School. We greeted some wonderful new members to our church family, and we said "until we meet again" to special people who went to be with the Lord. Oh, and we received 3-year pledges totaling \$691,000 to the campaign to restore and upkeep our church building and \$236,000 has already been paid. (We are still accepting pledges). AND OUR GIVING EXCEEDED OUR CHURCH BUDGET BY \$19,100. Please know that God is leading us, using us, and empowering us to do amazing and wonderful things! Thank you for your faithfulness to God. To God be the Glory. Thank You FBC Family

I want to reiterate in The Scope what I said from the pulpit this past Sunday: Thank you Church Family for the outpouring of love and kindness you shared with the Young Family this Christmas. The cards, the gifts, the gift cards, the sweet and savory treats and your benevolent words were overwhelming and life-giving. Please know that we love and appreciate you so much, and I look forward to serving alongside you as your pastor in the year and years ahead.
