The Scope

Pastor's Corner Dr. Bert Young

Sometimes the most effective preaching does not answer all our questions about a biblical text or topic but rather leads us to grapple with new lines of inquiry; and, sometimes when the preacher finishes a sermon, rather than feeling as if he/she has presented a crisply wrapped gift with a tightly tied bow on top, the preacher feels as if only the introduction has been shared with the congregation. Such was the case with me on Sunday and perhaps (I hope) it was for you, too. If you recall, toward the end of Sunday's sermon "Carrying Our Mantles," I suggested that God does not so much care about the result of our efforts at holiness, goodness, and faithfulness, but that God's mercy is freely bestowed on those who sincerely and earnestly strive to be holy, good, and faithful. God cares more about our intentions and motivations than God does about our results or production. This idea is not new or from me. The thought to transition us into worship Sunday was from Mother Teresa who said, "Our progress in holiness depends on God and ourselves—on God's grace and on our will to be holy. We must have a real living determination to be holy." The same idea is echoed by the famous prayer of trappist monk Thomas Merton in which he prays, "... the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope to have that desire in all that I am doing." How else God could say in scripture that arrogant, lecherous, murderous David, was "a man after God's own heart?" There is both relief as well as challenge in this understanding of God's expectations and mercies. Have you ever played golf, or even putt-putt, where the tee box is not aligned with the fairway or where you need to hit the ball, so that even if you strike the ball perfectly and it flies or rolls straight as an arrow, your ball still lands in trouble. Life has a way of similarly deceiving us. We focus our hearts, minds, and efforts on some worldly end—whether it be wealth, power, fame, security, comfort, control—yet we believe we are seeking and loving God with all of our hearts, souls, minds, and strength. Or perhaps we have been duped into relying solely on God's grace without any regard for our own efforts at spiritual growth, maturity and sanctification. Certainly God's grace is indeed amazing and none of us can find abundant life without it, but we musn't forget that God's grace is most readily offered to those who are striving to live in and do the will of God (no matter how successfully or unsuccessfully). So how do we insure that we are living and longing to please God? One word: PRAYER. It is a matter of prayer--- everyday, every moment—we pray for God to shape our intentions and desires. As the praise chorus says, "Change my heart, O God, make it ever true. Change my heart, O God, may I be like you." This is a prayer, when prayed sincerely, humbly, and vulnerably, that will be heard by God and answered by the Holy Spirit. Praying this prayer allows us to abide in God's mercy and grace as we become more holy, and help the world move closer to being the Kingdom God intends.

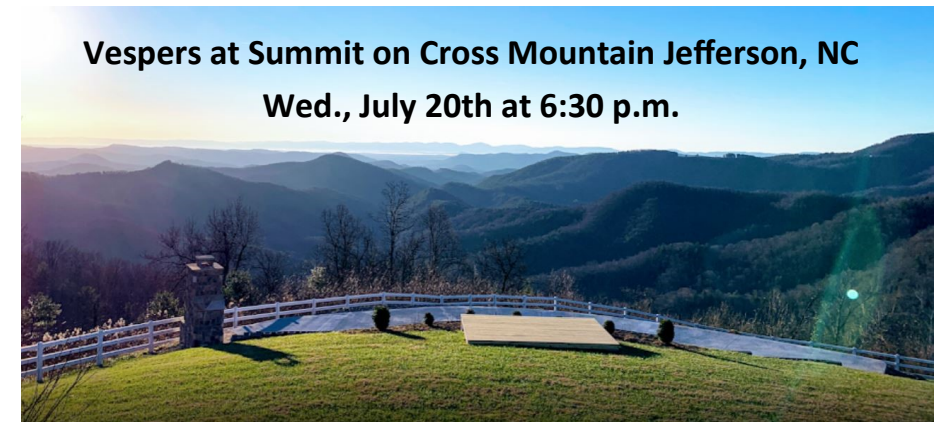
