An Exciting New Ministry at FBC

The First Baptist Church of North Wilkesboro Deacon In-House Committee has unanimously voted to begin a new ministry called a "Free Food Giveaway" for needy families in our community. We will work together with HOPE Ministries to help feed Wilkes residents by providing bags of groceries once per quarter. Our goal is to supply 40-45 families with pre-packed food and hygiene items based on family size. We will rely on the generosity of our church congregation for food and hygiene item donations.

Our church members will give away the bags of food to families as they drive through the Portico carport on a Saturday morning between 9:00—11:00 on a date to be determined in mid to late October. The “Free Food Giveaway” will replace the current Little Food Pantry project which has a number of issues including food spoilage in heat and cold, abuse by people, no personal connection with the individuals, and no Christian message of prayer and compassion. There are currently four other churches in Wilkes County working with HOPE Ministries to offer free food on a Saturday when all other services are closed. This ministry will show the community that our church cares for them and for the needs of our county.

Donations

Our team will setup collection bins just as we do today for the HOPE Ministry donations in the Portico entrance, Sunday School back entrance, Narthex entrance, and in front of the church library. We will designate what items are needed each week and we will ensure communication to the congregation will be regular and concise. This project is to work along with HOPE Ministries and not to replace our church's support of their other ministries and outreach programs. Below are the food and hygiene items that will be collected, and the timeline for collection.

It goes without saying, that it is vitally important for everyone to be in attendance at this Small-Group Organizational Session. (Did I mention there will be homemade ice cream?)

Speaking of homemade ice cream, IF you have an ice cream churn, and would be willing to bring a batch of your favorite homemade ice cream on August 27, please call the church office and let Katie or me know.

A New Christmas Shoebox Ministry

This Fall we will partner with Olive Branch Ministries and their Christmas Boxes for Appalachia program. This effort is led by Rev. Scarlett Jasper who grew up in the impoverished Appalachian region of Kentucky, but emerged to earn her M.Div at the Baptist Seminary of Kentucky with a concentration in Pastoral Care and Counseling. She was commissioned as a Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Field Personnel and Rural Poverty Advocate in 2014, and Rev. Jasper knows how to relate to and connect with this eccentric group of mountain folk.

We will provide shoeboxes for you to fill with toboggans (hats) and gloves for the winter along with school supplies, candy, and little toys. We will deliver them to the First Baptist Church of Corbin, KY in November. The most amazing part of this ministry is that Rev. Jaspar uses the Shoeboxes to develop relationships with families in deep poverty so that she can engage them in other programs that greatly benefit them, such as: Financial Literacy Programs, Microloan Programs, Child and Youth Counseling and Case Management, Pop Up Health Clinics, Free Laundry Days, and a plethora of useful self-help workshops. Of course, the love and grace of Christ is also shared.

We are so fortunate that Ginger Edmiston and Tammy Watts have stepped forward to Co-Lead this Missional Effort. Please stay tuned for more details. It’s not too early to start stock-piling school supplies, candy, winter gloves and hats. We will distribute a complete list of suggested items in the near future. \$5 should be included for shipping.

We also have the potential to go to Kentucky next year to participate in a Habitat for Humanity Extreme Build where lots of volunteers work together to build 20 or so houses in one week, OR there may be other opportunities through Olive Branch Missions where we can be the hands and feet of Christ.
